Fulfills Honors ethics

Fulfills Honors ethics, Honors philosophy

SOCI-H396-033 “Violence and Democracy”

Fulfills Honors social justice seminar, Honors social science

CHEM-H245-033 “Chemistry and Art”

Fulfills Honors science, Honors Arts and Culture

CLHU-H295-033 “Art and Mythology”

Fulfills Honors Arts and Culture

ENGL-H487-033 “Contemporary Critical Issues”

Fulfills Honors literature – not recommended for first year students

ENGL-H496-034 “From Harlem to Hip Hop”

Fulfills Honors literature – not recommended for first year students

HIST-H338-033 “Civil War and Reconstruction”

HIST-H295-035 “American Folk Culture”

Fulfills Honors history or Honors Arts and Culture

HIST-H396-033 “Incarceration in America”

Fulfills Honors social justice seminar, Honors history

PHYS-H330-033 “Faith, Science, Religion Honors”

Fulfills Honors science or Honors religious studies

PSYC-H295-033 “Science of Sexual Orientation: A Psychobiological Developmental Approach”

Fulfills Honors science or Honors social science

GREK-H100 and **LATN-H100** can count as either the foreign language requirement OR replace an Honors disciplinary requirement

MATH-H295-033 “Honors Mathematics”

Or any non-Honors Calculus I or higher
